Indianapolis June 1, 1839

Council met; present Nathan B. Palmer President, George Lockerbie, William Sullivan, Philip W. Seibert, John E. McCluer, George Norwood and Samuel S. Rooker Councilmen.

On Motion of Mr. McCluer:-

Resolved that a committee be appointed to examine the manner in which Matthew Lytle is straightening Pogues run, by cutting the banks thereof, and that said committee report to the next meeting of the Council.

Messrs. McCluer, Lockerbie & Sullivan were appointed said com

Ordered, That the level of the grade for side walks, on Pennsylvania Street between Washington and Ohio Streets be elevated three inches above the original plan as laid down by the Town Surveyor and Engineer.

On Motion of Mr. Seibert

Resolved That individuals owning lots or parts of lots lying on the thirty foot alleys in the town of Indianapolis be permitted to use four foot of said alleys lying next to their said property for the purpose a wood pile.

On Motion of Mr. McCluer.

Resolved That a committee be appointed to examine the grade of the side walks on Washington Street and report at the next meeting of the Council whether any change in said grade is necessary.

Messrs. McCluer, Seibert, Sullivan & President Palmer were appointed said Committee.

On Motion of Mr. Seibert:-

Resolved That a committee be appointed to examine what work has been done in the North part of the town of Indianapolis and near R.R. Underhills residence, and report thereon at the next meeting of the Common Council.

Messrs. Sullivan, McCluer & Lockerbie were appointed sd. com.

On Motion of Mr. Sullivan:

Resolved That a committee of three be appointed, to procure a temporary loan, not exceeding ninety days duration, nor Five hundred dollars in amount to meet the liabilities of the Corporation now due, and falling due before the revenue of 1839 can be collected.

Messrs. Sullivan, Seibert and Norwood were appointed said committee.

On Motion of Mr. Sullivan:-

Resolved That all persons receiving permission from the Council for License to retail liquors, shall take out the same forth with, or immediately on the expiration of their old

license, otherwise they shall be prosecuted as the law directs in such case; and it is hereby made the duty of the Marshal to call upon each applicant within one week after the permission is given to see that he has taken out license and in case he has not, to report him to the president immediately, that he may put the law in force.

Mr. Norwood offered the following viz.

Whereas Complaints are frequently made by the purchasers of meat in our Markets of the insufficiency and uncertainty of weight: therefore:-

Resolved That no Butcher or any other individual who may hold a stall in either of the Market houses shall sell meat, after the first day of July next, in any other way than by weighing in Scales with weights to be approved by a Committee of the Council, appointed for that purpose.

Mr. R.B. Hanna presented an account against the Council which On Motion was laid on the table.

On Motion of Mr. McCluer.

Resolved That all porches and sheds on Washington Street and also all signs extending over the side walks more than four feet from the buildings, on said Street be removed within twenty days.

On Motion of Mr. Norwood

Resolved That a committee be appointed to enquire into the propriety of building a Culvert over the bayou on Indiana Avenue -
Messrs. Norwood, Rooker & Seibert were appointed said Committee.

William Campbell was Allowed \$24:43 for removing nuisances in 1838 as per account filed.

(Issued 1. June 1839)

On Motion of Mr. Seibert;

Resolved That a Committee be appointed to revise the laws and Ordinances of the Common Council of the town of Indianapolis, And that said Committee employ such clerical aid as may be necessary.

Messrs. Seibert, McCluer, Lockerbie & Palmer were appointed said Committee.

James Vanblaricum was allowed \$106:56 $\frac{1}{2}$ for money which has been expended by him as Supervisor on the Streets in the town of Indianapolis.

James Vanblaricum was allowed \$58: for money to be expended by him as Supervisor on the Streets in the Town of Indianapolis.

Centre of the Street and shall be made a regular grade to the East
end of Mr. Philips pavement: And on the South Side of Washington
Street from Pennsylvania Street West to the Alley the pavement
shall be a regular and continuous grade and the Surface next to the
buildings shall be 4 inches above the centre of the Street All of
which pavements shall be inclined towards the Street so as to fall
six inches.

Ordered That Monday next the 10th inst be Set as day on which
the Common Council will meet to hear and determine all appeals
from the valuation & return to the Lister.

Mr. R.R. Underhill & others presented a petition on the subject
of grading Pennsylvania Street etc. which was laid on the table.

On Motion of Mr. Seibert:

Resolved. That the Supervisor be directed so soon as he shall
have worked out the road tax, to proceed without delay to mend and
repair all the bad portions of the Noblesville road - the Michigan
road - Crewfordsville - the bluff - the Madison and the Fort Wayne
road within the limits of the donation.

On Motion of Mr. McCluer.

Resolved That the Committee heretofore appointed on the subject
of Bridges advertise for proposals to make or construct a
Culvert on Indiana Avenue; and that the Committee on the subject
of the Culvert make out a plan for said Culvert:

On Motion of Mr. McCluer

Resolved That the Supervisor have the Bridge over Pogues run on Pennsylvania Street immediately repaired.

Ordered That a tax of $\frac{1}{4}$ of one per cent be levied on real and personal property returned by the Lister and also that a tax of \$1 be levied on each poll and \$1. on each dog returned by the Lister for the present year (1839.)

And the Council adjourned until Monday the 10th inst at 10 o'clock A.M. on said day.

James Vanblaricum was appointed collector of the Revenue for the town of Indianapolis for the year 1839.

An Ordinance to regulate proceedings and prosecutions before the President of the Common Council of the town of Indianapolis. was read, amended, passed and ordered to be published.

An Ordinance to restrain the Licensing of Groceries and Tippling houses in the town of Indianapolis & for other purposes, was read, amended, passed and ordered to be published.

An Ordinance for the Appointment of a town Auctioneer and to provide for Licensing itinerant Auctioneers, was read, amended, passed and ordered to be published.

An Ordinance to provide for the Appointment of town Surveyor and Engineer and to define his duties and Compensation, was read, amended, passed and ordered to be published.

And the Council adjourned.

Mr. McCluer offered the following Resolution which was adopted.

Whereas it has heretofore been determined by the Common Council, that the Secretary should be allowed quarterly such sum of money as the labor performed by him would justly entitle him to, for such preceeding quarter - And Whereas the labor necessarily performed by him during the first quarter has been greater than will probably be done during the three succeeding quarters of the year, Therefore:-

Resolved That the Secretary be allowed \$100. for the first quarter and \$25. for each of the succeeding quarters of the ensuing year, said sums payable as they are severally due.

Council met at 3 O'clock, the President in the Chair, Members present Locherbie, Sullivan, Norwood, Seibert, and McClure.

The Secretary being absent, on motion Mr. Sullivan was appointed Secretary pro tem. Minutes of the last meeting read & approved.

Messrs. Ballenger & Etter made application for Lisense to keep a Coffee House for one year, to date from the 16th of April last, which was granted upon complying with the requisitions of the this Council.

The Branch Bank of the State of Indiana at Indianapolis by its President and Cashier Petitioned for privelege to erect an Iron railing within four feet of the Banking house on Pennsylvania Street, and to extend in length the whole distance of the Bank, and to Pave the Street the ordinary width; which Petition was granted.

John F. Ramsey appealed to have \$1125.00, too much, assessed upon his Personal Property remitted, which was on motion remitted.

A Petition from Sundry Citizens praying that a Public Pump be erected in the N.W. section of the 5th Ward, was presented and Messrs Norwood, Seibert, and McClure were appointed a Committee to enquire and report upon the same.

The Secretary was directed to issue the \$300. allowed to Messrs Elder, Colestock & Co on the 13th July 1839 in one hundred dollar orders.

The Marshall was directed to supply each officer and member of the Council with a copy of the Charter and Ordinances.

Ordered that the Marshal leave fifty copies of the Ordinances with Y. Wily, Bookseller and a like number with Messrs Brown Booksellers sold and accounted for at 25cts per copy

On Motion Warfield Young's road Tax was remitted.

On Motion the Surveyor was directed to lay off and stake, with white posts to be painted, the North Square of the Public Grave yard, agreeably the plan agreed upon

On Motion Messrs McClure, Seibert, and Norwood, were appointed a Com. to wait on Mr. Hogland and desire him to keep his son Henry from running at large in the town of Indianapolis

The Committee on Mr Kinders' petition for compensation for removing drift out of Pagues Run in 1838 reported him not entitled to any, and were discharged.

Messrs Seibert and McClure were appointed a Committee upon the side walk in front of Lytelle's Hotel on Washinton St. to report at the next meeting.

On Motion the Marshal or Collector is directed to receive the Certificates of Clerks, Judges, and Inspectors of town Elections at 50 cents for each days Services rendered, in payment of road Tax for the years 1838 & 1839.

The Treasurer, Weighmaster, and Clerks of the Markets reported and their reports were accepted.

The following bills were presented, and the Secretary ordered to draw on the Treasurer for the amounts

1 A Bill in favour of John Livingston for Printing from the 8th of Decr 1838 to this date, Fifty one dollars and twenty five cents (\$51.25)

2 A Bill in favour of R B. Hanna for Surveying and Engineering to this date Ten dollars (\$10)

3 An additional allowance of Four dollars and twenty five cents (\$4.25) in favour of Mr. Dawson on account of Grave Yard Gate.

(Issued Sep 11th)

(On Motion the time for taking down the awning Rafters across the Pavements was extended to the First of October 1839.)

Resolved, That it shall hereafter be the duty of the corporation assessor to assess all real property, within the limits of the donation for the purpose of enabling the Common Council to levy a tax for road purposes.

The object of the meeting having been stated by the chair to refer to the decease of Samuel Goldsberry Councilman of the 2nd Ward. Mr. Harrison presented the following minute which was unanimously adopted to wit:

"Whereas the Common Council of Indianapolis have learned with the deepest regret that Samuel Goldsberry, a member of the Common Council for the last seven years, departed this life on this the 16th day of January A.D. 1847.

Therefore, Be it resolved unanimously.

That the following minute be entered on the minute book of the Town Council.

That the deceased was justly held in the highest estimation by the Members of the Common Council, as a man of the kindest feelings - upright in all his dealings - faithful and true in all his transactions as a Member of this Council, and in every way deserving of the respect and confidence of his Neighbors, and that his death is regarded by us as a public loss.

That the Common Council tender to the widow and family of the deceased their sincere sympathy and condolence for their great loss.

That the Secretary of the Common Council be directed to transcribe a copy of the foregoing preamble & minutes, and deliver the same to the widow of the deceased under the Town Seal.

Resolved Further, That the Common Council and the Officers thereof will attend the funeral of the deceased in a body, with the appropriate badges of Mourning On the left arm.

On Motion, the following Minute is directed to be entered of Record to wit:

By an act of the Legislature of 9th Feby. 1831, the agent of State for the town of Indianapolis, was directed to make an Accuzate Survey of the lands around said town etc. according to the plat presented by the said agent to the Legislature, and to cause to be made out, two complete maps or plats of the town of Indianapolis, designating the names and width of the several streets & alleys etc. & to deposite one of said Maps in the office of the Recorder of Marion County, and from that time "it shall be considered a public Record." Which map was subsequently on the day of July 1831 deposited in said office.

Portions of several of the Streets & alleys on the Outskirts of the Town, have been enclosed by the Owners of Property adjacent to them, simply for their own present convenience, and not at all with a view of vacating them.

By this unexpected decision, the beauty and Symmetry of the Capitol of the State will be seriously marred, and the property of individuals, who bought in the Neighborhood of such Streets, and with a view to them as a part of the privileges of such property very materially injured.

As the fee-simple of the Ground, was by grant of Congress in the State, the vacating of Streets & alleys does not vest the title there- to in the Owners of the adjacent property, but the same return to the State, - and as all the citizens of the State have an interest in the Capitol, in her public grounds - her streets & alleys, the Common Council of the town of Indianapolis respectfully ask the legislature to pass a law repealing all laws or parts of laws, that in any wise change or vacate any of the streets or alleys as shown by the Map aforesaid, and declaring the streets and alleys as shown by said Map, together with any other Streets or alleys that may have been laid out & a Map thereof recorded to be the streets and alleys of said town.

Ordered That the Secretary of the Common Council have a certified copy of the foregoing Minute, and of this order before the President of the Senate & the Speaker of the House of Representatives who are hereby requested to lay the same before the body over which they res- pectively preside.

The Committee respectfully report that they have had the Subject under consideration but owing to the quantity of water now in said ditch, they have been prevented from making an accurate examination or from ascertaining particularly the best manner of completing the required repairs - A partial examination has recently been made by S. B. Wilson Esq. under the direction of B. Brown Superintendent of the Central Canal, from which it may be presumed that thorough

& efficient repairs can be made for the sum of three hundred dollars. It is understood that individual subscriptions can be obtained to the amount of Seventy dollars, and that the Superintendent of the Canal will appropriate whatever amount may be found necessary to complete said repairs, over as expenditure by the Council & individuals of One hundred & Seventy five dollars.

Your Committee therefore recommend that the sum of One hundred dollars be appropriated to the repair of said ditch, payable out of the revenue of the coming year. - which report was concurred in and the committee discharged.

On Motion of Mr. Harrison

Resolved.
