"The Face of Nature Changes as Art & Science Evolve" by Carl Zimmer in the **NYTimes** for 23 November points to the new alliances between the two disciplines, as witnessed by Joseph Scheer's show at the Field Museum and Rosamund Purcell's at the Harvard dept. of the history of science.
