8 months of photographs documentating the exhausting and painstaking recovery effort of the world Trade Center site can be seen at www.septembereleven.net with photos by Gary Suson, a Manhattan photographer and actor, who was allowed entree into areas closed to most people.

Joel Meyerowitz, under the auspices of the Museum of the City of New York and help from Amodeo Pulley, a detective in the Arson and Explosion Squad, shot 7,000 photographs after months of taking photos four or five days a week. A show of 27 of these pictures, sponsored by the U.S. State Department, is now traveling the world. He photographed collections of things and sights: beams, chairs, tents, wires, welders' doodles in steel, fire hoses, tree stumps, men with duct tape around their legs. He especially liked photographing at night.

BEAT MOVEMENT

The Beat Movement as lived by Ginsberg. Many photographs, as well as handwritten manuscript pages of Ginsberg's poetry, audio clips, selected artwork, and video clips are featured at www.allenginsberg.org, a Web site founded in March that is devoted to the life of the poet, who died in 1997 at age 70. The site, financed by the A.G. Trust of New York, has ambitions of becoming a definitive research archive, but some sections are meatier than others.

PRESERVATION OF DIGITAL ART

Digital art is so ephemeral that often viewers don't get a chance to see it before it disappears. A new project by Kendra Mayfield is proposing a set of rules to document and preserve variable media art before it slips away:

CHILDREN'S BOOK COLLECTION

The Koninklijke Bibliotheek in The Hague has just acquired the following publication:

Sebastiaan S. Hesselink (with Agnes M.L. Kerssemakers), The Children's World of Learning 1480-1880. 't goyhouten, hes & de graaf, 2002.

The children's world of learning is the catalogue of a collection of printed books, manuscripts, broadsides and prints illustrating four centuries of education and popular culture in Western Europe with emphasis on the Low Countries. The collection was started by Mr. Hesselink in 1984 with the acquisition at an auction in Amsterdam of a sizable part of the library of children's books and books on related subjects, collected by the late Mr. C.F. van Veen. The collection, grown to more than 5500 items, was then originally published as catalogue 100 of Antiquariaat FORUM in eleven instalments between 1994-2002.

The catalogue has now been published in 3 extensive and richly illustrated volumes, in illustrated slip-case. All titles are expertly described and situated in their cultural-historical context. The catalogue contains 1183 illustrations of which 351 in full colour, on 1615 pages. It is an interesting reference work for everyone interested in the history of education and children's books, especially in Western-Europe and The Netherlands.
